


ASEAN Centre for Biodiversity

(supported by ratification of the governments)




ACB Programme Areas





A protected area of high conservation importance preserving in total a complete spectrum of representative ecosystems of the ASEAN Region.

A flagship programme of the ASEAN that manages a regional network of representative protected areas created to generate greater collaboration between ASEAN Member States in preserving their shared natural heritage




AHPs

- ASEAN Heritage Parks (AHPs) are selected protected areas in the ASEAN region which are known for their unique biodiversity and ecosystems, wilderness and outstanding values.
- AHPs were given the highest recognition because of their importance as conservation areas
- As of 2020, a total of 49 ASEAN Heritage Parks had been established, the distribution is as follows:
Brunei Darussalam - 1; Cambodia - 2; Indonesia - 7; Lao PDR - 1; Malaysia - 3; Myanmar - 8; Philippines - 9; Singapore - 2; Thailand - 6; and Viet Nam - 10.

Small Grants Programme I

Overall Programme Objective:

Strengthening of biodiversity protection and management of natural resources in line with the basic needs of the local population in the ASEAN region by strengthening the ACB in its role to promote biodiversity protection.

Module objectives (impact level)

- a) to improve biodiversity protection in line with the interests of the local population directly dependent on selected AHPs and adjacent areas;
- b) to improve the livelihood of local communities directly dependent on selected AHPs or adjacent areas;
- c) to strengthen the role of ACB in promoting biodiversity protection among the ASEAN member states.

Module objectives (outcome level)

- To implement successful interventions covering both biodiversity and livelihood aspects in selected AHPs and adjacent areas



Indonesia

The Memorandum of Understanding (Mou) for Indonesia is up to 2019. KfW has approved the proposal of extension up to December 2021 with the total budget as of EUR 2,000,000 (EUR 1,000,000 additional fund from the initial budget)

Penabulu Foundation, Service Provider for SGP Indonesia, begins the contract from March 2019 to December 2021 or for 34 months duration of the contract

Training, orientation, and joint visit of the SP and other partners
